Re-Entry Plan

2020 – 2021 School Year
In response to COVID-19

INTRODUCTION

We have created this summary plan in response to the current COVID-19 situation in preparation for school re-entry where students, staff members, and families feel safe to do so. The summary guidelines are prefaced by the Saddle Lake Cree Nation (onihcikiskwapowin) Education Law.

As quoted from our Education Law: As a nation, we possess the ability to exercise control and direction over the education of each generation as set out in the nehiyaw laws of miyo-opohkinawasiwin, wahkohtowin and many others that are not written but found in our ceremonies. onihcikiskwapowin (SLCN) ceremonies will be practiced in the Education Authority's schools to the extent and in a manner, which the Education Authority and Elders Council will determine.

HEALTH PROTOCOL

For the health and safety of all, please preregister your child/children at the school as new students will not be accepted unless they are registered. Please refrain from having your child/children move school to school during the re-entry period which is September 3 to September 30.

Any students, parents, staff and community members becoming ill at school and work place or if another person is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 will be required to leave the school and/or work place to go home or to the nearest health center for testing. **SLCN Health Center 780-726-3930**

Students returning to school from an approved medical leave should contact their school administrators. Parents may be asked to submit a healthcare provider's note before returning to school.

Masks and COVID 19 testing will be mandatory for all staff and students. All students will receive a backpack once they complete their COVID 19 testing.

VISITOR RESTRICTIONS

Saddle Lake Education Authority will not allow normal visitation to our schools. Only staff are allowed in the schools during preparation for reopening.

Visitors will be required to make an appointment with the office if and when they need to visit.

TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS

Saddle Lake Education Authority Staff will discontinue staff travel to conferences and workshops until further notice. Online or virtual learning opportunities will be sought out and encouraged.

Staff, parents, guardians and students will be required to fill out "**Trip/Journey Management Form**" when travelling out of SLCN for **contact** tracing processes. Contact the Director of Emergency Management or Public Information Officer at the Administration Office 780-726-3829.

HOW TO USE HAND SANITIZER

- 1 Apply enough sanitizer into your palm
- 2 Rub hands together, palm to palm
- 3 Keep rubbing during 20 seconds
- 4 Rub hands until they become dry

Wash Your Hands

- Rinse hands
- Use soap
- Palm to palm
- Back to hands
- Base of thumbs
- Finger interlaced
- Wrists
- Fingernails

COVID-19 INFORMATION

HOW TO WEAR A NON-MEDICAL MASK

Non-medical masks, including homemade cloth masks, can help prevent the spread COVID-19. They are another tool to use in places where it's difficult to keep two metres from other people for extended periods of time – such as public transit, grocery stores, pharmacies, hair salons, airplanes and some retail shops.

Masks do not replace proper hygiene, physical distancing or isolation to prevent the spread.

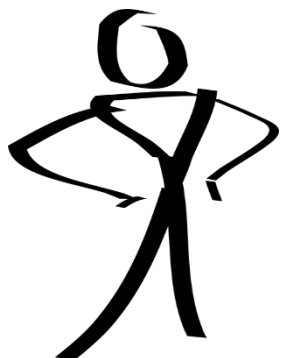
SAFELY PUTTING A MASK ON

- 1 Wash/sanitize your hands.
- 2 Inspect the mask, holding it by the ties or loops. Discard if damaged or dirty.
- 3 Open fully to cover from the bridge of your nose to your chin.
- 4 Adjust the mask to your face so there are no gaps on the sides.
- 5 If mask has stiff edge, pinch to close gaps between nose and mask.
- 6 Keep your nose, mouth and chin covered at all times. Avoid touching the mask.

SAFELY TAKING OFF A MASK

- 1 Wash/sanitize your hands.
- 2 Remove it from the back by releasing ties or loops. Do not touch the front of the mask.
- 3 Discard the mask immediately if disposable. Wash thoroughly if reusable.
- 4 Wash/sanitize your hands.

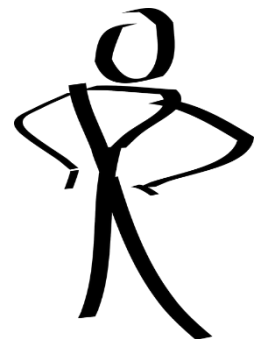
SOCIAL DISTANCING is an effective way to prevent potential infection. Saddle Lake Education Authority employees, students, parents, and visitors should practice staying approximately 2 metres away from others and eliminating contact with others.

POSSIBLE SCENARIOS

Common areas (*guidelines for all 5 scenarios*): lunch room, library, gym, playground, CTS Construction, & Food Studies.

Student learning will be focused on: Literacy, Numeracy, Cree, and Land-based learning.

Health and Safety Guidelines: DAILY disinfecting, Mandatory PPE (MASKS), mandatory sign in/out for STUDENT and STAFF, Social Distancing, Hand Sanitizing, Staff Training from Emergency Management and Health Center

Parents have the option of transporting their children to school if they so choose.

Jr high students attend by grade • Daily disinfecting, cleaning checklists and student clean-up |
| <p>Scenario 3</p> | <p>MODIFIED RETURN WITH WEEKLY COHORTS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student cohorts-1 week on/off (learn through hybrid of online and Remote Learning Home Package) • Students will be learning through online delivery or homework packages during their week at home • 4-day week, Wednesday disinfecting & staff collaboration |
| <p>Scenario 4</p> | <p>HYBRID OF REMOTE LEARNING WITH ONLINE AND HOMEWORK PACKAGES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Literacy and numeracy focus • The need for home internet and hardware • Possible food distribution for SLEA families |
| <p>Scenario 5</p> | <p>OVER CAPACITY RETURN</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An influx of students and the need for additional portable classrooms • 50% capacity with modified scheduling and space. For example, spaces such as the gymnasium and library would be designated as classrooms. |
